Data Center Site Certification

Tennessee Valley Authority has recognized the Northeast College Site as a Certified Data Center Site. The initiative is part of TVA's economic development strategy to target the data center industry, a rapidly-growing industry that provides good-paying jobs for highly skilled employees. TVA is partnering with local power companies and regional, state and community economic development leaders as part of a data center recruitment initiative to market sites across TVA's seven-state service area. The application for certification was a joint-effort of Jackson County EDA and DeKalb County EDA.

The certification means that the site, located adjacent to Northeast Alabama Community College, is ideal for building and operating data center facilities which house computer systems and components, such as telecommunications and storage systems used by internet search engines and other high-tech industries. Criteria for selection of the sites include accessibility, strong telecommunications infrastructure and availability of reliable electric power.

In addition to the Data Center Site Certification, we are also in the process of having the Northeast College Site designated as an Alabama "AdvantageSite."

We recently met with Economic Development Partnership of Alabama (EDPA) for a consultation to ensure the Northeast College Site meets the requirements for AdvantageSite documentation and data, including environmental studies, geotechnical conditions, infrastructure status, accessibility, size, ownership/control, and zoning.

AdvantageSite is a great program and a very effective marketing tool that benefits us, our prospects, and site consultants. Having all due diligence complete and certified saves time and money and makes the whole process of information-sharing more efficient.

Jackson County Industrial Park was the first site in Alabama to be designated an AdvantageSite in 2008, and was re-designated in 2012. Having two in Jackson County will be a great asset to our economic development efforts!
